
#### **Governmental Transparency**

State of New Jersey

566 municipalities

Open Public Records Act

 Sunshine Law—Open Public Meetings Act

#### **Level of Analysis**

- Municipal:
  - Towns, townships, cities, boroughs, etc.
  - Not state or county level of government.
- Individuals' perceptions of the components of municipal transparency.

#### Research Design

Soaking and poking

- Interviews with individuals from:
  - Good government groups
  - Journalist
  - Local Governments-city administrators, clerks, municipal attorney
